However, if you have a **family history of cancers** like I(Peter Moon) do and PSA continues to go up or treatment fails , you should get a germline test to help you with treatment choices. I met Mr. Alan Sturke at Henrico Doctors' Sarah Cannon Cancer center off of Skipwith rd. when getting a blood draw as part of an NIH Genetic study my brother (Don) in Seattle Wa. enrolled the Moon Brothers in. Mr. Sturke is a geneticist who does germline testing for cancer doctors at that hospital and I recommend him as someone you can work with.
